The proposed streetscape will engage the pedestrian with planters and decorative railing.

The proposed streetscape will create more pedestrian space with bump-outs and improve the usability of that space with the addition of street trees for shade.



Project Description

PROJECT VISION

With the opening of part of the Hoosier Heartland Highway in 2013, most truck traffic will be eliminated from the downtown. This allows Delphi to take back our downtown and create a pedestrian friendly environment, conducive to outdoor dining, specialty shops, new restaurants and downtown residential living. This project will implement a new pedestrian friendly streetscape design to support this vision.

Work will include six blocks of downtown streetscape improvements. New period street lighting will be installed, along with new sidewalks, curbs, pavement, brick paver accents, street furniture and related amenities. Bump-outs will be added at intersections to improve pedestrian safety and to add landscape areas. Improvements will be coordinated with concurrent downtown utility improvements and façade work.

PROJECT READINESS

All work is scheduled to occur in right-of-way already owned by the City or INDOT. Conceptual designs for the project are complete. The city will immediately begin procurement for this work upon award of the project.

PROJECT BUDGET

\$5.6 million


PROJECT SCHEDULE
