

BOARD OF WORKS & PUBLIC SAFETY
August 29, 2023 – 6:15 PM
Second Floor, City Building, 201 S. Union Street

Mayor Anita Werling opened the meeting at 6:15 p.m. Those present rose for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Leanne Aldrich called the roll. Present were Spencer Kingery, Breanna Maxwell, and Mayor Werling.

Chief LaMar presented two claims which will be on the September 5 docket, but which require checks to be written in advance of that date.

The first claim for \$50 was for basic training from the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy for new officer Daron Dennis who will be sworn in at 5:30 p.m. September 1, 2023.

The second claim of \$13,900 was to Chicago Motors for a 2016 Ford Taurus AWD police vehicle with 73,361 miles. LaMar test drove the vehicle and negotiated a better price along with a replacement windshield and a spare tire. The vehicle will allow the take-home car policy to go into effect once the three new vehicles on order are received. LaMar intends to assign the vehicle to himself. Spencer Kingery asked about engine idle hours. LaMar stated that the vehicle had 5,000 engine idle hours which was far less than the City's 2019 vehicle with more than 9,000 idle hours. Kingery asked where the money would come from; LaMar responded Garage and Motor which had a current balance of around \$21,000. The car would need some additional outfitting costs. Once checked out mechanically, the City might want to consider an extended warranty at around \$1,500.

Spencer Kingery moved to approve the claims. Second by Breanna Maxwell. Motion carried. (3-0)

No comments or requests from board members or Clerk-Treasurer Aldrich.


Public Comment.
