RESOLUTION NO. 2024-15

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF SURPLUS VEHICLES OWNED BY THE CITY OF DELPHI, INDIANA

RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF DELPHI, INDIANA, AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF UNUSED FLEET VEHICLES OWNED BY THE CITY OF DELPHI, INDIANA

WHEREAS, the City of Delphi, Indiana is in possession of fleet vehicles, as identified in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto, that are no longer needed or are no longer fit for their intended purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Delphi, Indiana finds it is in the best interest of the City that said vehicles should be declared to be surplus property and disposed of by sale pursuant to Indiana Code § 5-22-22, et seq.

WHEREAS, Indiana Code § 5-22-22-4.5 allows for the sale of property belonging to a governmental body, by internet sale.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Delphi, Indiana that:

Section 1. The vehicles identified in Exhibit A are deemed surplus property.

Section 2. The Mayor is authorized to conduct the sale of the vehicles by internet sale on http://www.govdeals.com/. Said vehicles shall be sold "as is," and no guarantees to the current condition or operability are provided.

Section 3. The Clerk-Treasurer is directed to advertise the Notice of Sale in the Carroll County Comet at least fifteen (15) days prior to listing the property on the online auction site. The Notice of Sale shall include the time, place, and terms of the sale in accordance with Indiana Code § 5-22-22-11.
